# **Global Agenda for Social Justice 3**

### A Project of the Justice 21 Committee of the Society for the Study of Social Problems

Chapter Proposals Due: November 22, 2024 Chapter Drafts Due: April 14, 2025 Final Chapter Due: September 01, 2025 Anticipated Publication Date: August 2026

The <u>Society for the Study of Social Problems (SSSP)</u> and the Justice 21 Committee are beginning our work on the third iteration of the publication the *Global Agenda for Social Justice*. This iteration of the series – *Global Agenda for Social Justice 3* – is the internationally-focused volume. It is designed to provide accessible insights into some of the world's most pressing social problems and proposes practicable international public policy responses to those problems.

This project affirms the resiliency and commitment of the SSSP to social justice scholarship. This volume will be a "global agenda for social justice," in that it will contain specific recommendations for action for elected officials, policy makers, and community members.

This work is scheduled to be published by Policy Press, an academic publisher at the <u>University of Bristol</u>, <u>UK</u>, as a project in public sociology.

We ask you, individually or with colleagues, to submit a brief proposal (1-2 pages max.) identifying a significant international / global social problem. The proposal should include the three sections as listed below and provide responses to each:

- Identify and define a concrete social problem of international / global scope and then answer the following three prompts in your proposal:
  - o **Prompt 1 Definition and Scope of Social Problem**: Clearly define the social problem and scope of the social problem for a non-specialist/generalist audience (i.e., what is the definition and extent of the social problem?).
  - Prompt 2 Evidence of Social Problem: Describe how we know this is a pressing social problem (i.e., what are the sources of data, information, or evidence that tell us about this social problem?).
  - o **Prompt 3 Example Recommendations to Address the Social Problem**: Explain the kinds of law, policy or social actions that can alleviate the social problem. These should be viable and actionable solutions for reducing, mitigating, solving, or abolishing the social problem.

Please submit a copy of your 1 to 2-page proposal <u>using the Google Form</u> by November 22, 2024. Chapter drafts will be due April 14, 2025, and final manuscripts will be due September 01, 2025. Final contributions will be limited to 3000 words maximum (or roughly ten double-spaced manuscript pages). The volume is expected to launch in August 2026.
