His recent teaching focused on politics, international relations, and migration. He also opened a news outlet in his province and reported on peace and conflict issues, including critiques of the Taliban. He has published his academic and media writing in magazines and newspapers and has been interviewed about issues of conflict and peace processes on television and news media.
Risk	This scholar reports risk due to his research focus on peace and conflict in Afghanistan and public comments he has made about the Taliban. He reports direct threats from the Taliban caused him to flee Afghanistan for Turkey.

Scholarship summary	This scholar holds a master's degree in Islamic law and jurisprudence ('15) from a university in Pakistan. In 2020 he began an online PhD program in political science. He anticipates graduating in November 2023. From 2017-2021 he served as a senior technical manager with Afghanistan's Ministry of Higher Education. He has been an assistant professor of law since 2014 and an assistant professor of Islamic culture since 2019 at two universities in Afghanistan. His current research is on elections in Afghanistan.
Risk summary	The scholar states that he faces risk because he has advocated against fundamentalism and radicalism and for human rights, women's education, and democracy. He says that the Taliban issued an official notice instructing him to leave his on-campus housing. He writes, "After the collapse of the previous regime in August 2021, my life as well as the lives of my family is at great risk. The risk comes from my affiliation with the previous regime and most importantly being involved in the promotion of democracy and working with international partners."

\*Given the urgency of the situation in Afghanistan, the candidate put forward here has not undergone SAR's standard vetting procedure at this time. We may still seek additional documentation in the future, but in the interest of expediency at this time we have gathered first person documentation from the candidate that demonstrates the urgency and gravity of their situation. Based on what we have gathered (indicated below) we believe this candidate is well-placed to make contributions to the university space, is likely to face risk if they remain in Afghanistan, and is highly deserving of any support that your institution may be able to provide. <p>This cleric, interfaith leader, and human rights advocate is well connected in the international human rights sphere and has numerous years of experience promoting interfaith dialogue, anti-extremism, and free speech. He directs a nonprofit organization that seeks to counter sectarianism and religious discrimination and is an advisory board member of a regional center for human rights. Previously, he served as an expert for an initiative promoting freedom of expression and for a UN human rights committee. He has been recognized for his work with international awards for peacebuilding and religious freedom. His references note that he has been an invaluable contributor to their human rights efforts, praising him as a “relentless fighter for democracy, equal rights, civic rights, and the rights to freedom of expression and freedom of religion in his country and the Middle East.” He is currently completing a fellowship at a university in Europe where he has been working on a project to involve religious leaders in peacebuilding and human rights efforts. Unable to safely continue his work in Bahrain, he seeks a position in Europe starting in November 2023 where he can continue his research and advocacy on religion, democracy, faith-based diplomacy, and human rights and Islam.</p>		
<b>STATEMENT OF THREAT/RISK</b>		
<p>This cleric and human rights advocate reports that he faced imprisonment, violence, judicial charges, and harassment and intimidation in relation to his human rights and pro-democracy activism. The practitioner and media articles indicate that he was detained for six months in 2011, during which he was tortured. Between June 2016 and March 2017, Bahraini authorities interrogated him on multiple occasions, charged him with “inciting hatred against the system of government” and “disseminating false news” and subjected him to a travel ban. Reports indicate that the Bahrain government has been targeting and prosecuting critics, including religious leaders, under these types of charges. Owing to these threats and to continue his human rights work, he relocated to another country from 2017-2020. Since returning to Bahrain, he reports facing renewed interrogation, threats, and intimidation from the government. Fearing risk of arrest, this cleric and human rights advocate seeks a position in Europe beginning in November 2023.</p>
